GREAT GRANDFATHER:

elchoir Rudolph Yenni (later 'Yenney'), our Great Grandfather, was born an only child to Rudolph and Anna Yenni in Canton Glarus, Switzerland on May 28, 1872. He attended public school there and received the standard education offered. He was also reared and confirmed in the Christian faith as delivered by the Reformed Church of Switzerland (fascinating history; check it out). At the age of 20, he emigrated to America, where he located in the area around the town of Elgin, Fayette County, Iowa (*Elgin is known as 'The Little Switzerland of Iowa'').



On June 14th, 1894, Melchoir married Bostrva Babler (also from Switzerland; see her bio below). The couple went on to have five children: Melchoir Jr., Freida, John, Elmer and Margaret. Bostrva went by the name 'Barbara' (of which we'll be referring to her from here on), while at the same time, Melchoir was also known to sometimes go by 'Mike', perhaps to sound more 'American' to those around them - which was a consideration to many immigrants of the time. During his early years in the states, Melchoir moved around and even experimented with farming in Minnesota and Iowa (3 to 4 years), but eventually landed back in the Elgin area, where he became employed in the service of the Chicago, Rock Island and Pacific Railway Company. There he would remain for the next 38 years before retiring in July 16, 1938.



By all accounts, he was a widely liked and respected man and – later in life - even served on the Elgin City Council for 14 years, until ill health forced him to resign his service. Melchoir became seriously ill on Friday, September 5, 1941 and passed away the following Monday morning, September 8th, at the age of 69 years, 3 months and 10 days. He was survived by his widow Barbara and all five of his children. In his obituary, it stated that Melchoir was "respected for his thoroughness and efficiency" and that "his family and friends loved him dearly for his characteristics of gentleness

and kindness". After the funeral, the five children (and their families) returned home: John to Waukegan, IL, Melchoir Jr. to Huron, SD, Freida (Mrs. R. A. Crider) to Elgin, and Elmer and Margaret (Mrs. Charles Knight) to Janesville, WI. Also attending the funeral (*'Uncle Chuck's brothers) were Mr./Mrs. Carlton Knight and Mr./Mrs. J. E. Knight, both of Fayette.

GREAT GRANDMOTHER:

Bostrva 'Barbara' Babler Yenney, our Great Grandmother and Melchoir's only wife, was one of five children born to (father) Friedolin and (mother) Elsbeth Babler in Nitfurin, Canton Glarus, Switzerland on September 15th, 1874. Like Melchoir, she attended the public school and was reared in the Christian faith of the Reformed Church of Switzerland. At the age of 19, Bostrva emigrated to America (at some point adopting the name 'Barbara') and - shortly after arrival on June 14, 1894 - was united in marriage to Melchoir Yenney. They had five children (see above and below). Excepting 3 years in WI/MN farming with her young husband, she spent the majority of her new living in and around the Elgin, IA area. Barbara Yenney became ill on Thursday, June 22, 1949

while in Janesville, WI visiting her son, Elmer. She passed away early Friday morning (July 1st) at the Mercy Hospital in Janesville. She was 74 years of age. She was preceded in death by her husband, Melchoir, but survived by all five children. In her obituary, it was written that "Mrs. Yenney was a home-loving soul. Her home and family always came first. Her hands were always busy when she was able".

7/27/1916	43	Son, Melchor Jr accepts a job as brakeman for the RR in Huron, SD.
5/10/1917	44	Son, Eighth-grade Elmer practices his part in the graduation exercise
12/27/1917	44	Son, John becomes a helper at the depot (railway station)
1/31/1918	45	Son, Elmer goes to work as an assistant at Capper's Store in Elgin
9/26/1918	45	Son, Melchoir Junior writes home to his parents Melchoir/Barbara from France - where he is stationed in WW1 - to tell them he met an Elgin boy, Fay Sullivan. He said they had a good visit and talked about home.
3/28/1918	45	Son, Elmer Yenney adds 35 cents to the Junior Red Cross Fund by selling a bird house he made to Mrs. Frank Capper
6/20/1918	45	Barbara Babler Yenney visits Melchoir in Cedar Rapids, where he is employed as a yard boss there.
2/6/1919	46	Melchoir (who is currently stationed at Cedar Rapids), comes home to Elgin to visit family for a few days.
5/29/1919	46	Melchoir (& friend John Johnson) return from Cedar Rapids after viewing the ruins of a starch factory explosion the previous Thursday evening.
7/3/1919	46	Melchoir Junior returns home from serving overseas during WW1, where he was a member of the 90th Division and served with the engineers. He's telling friends and family he goes by 'Mike' now.
9/18/1919	46	Sons, Melchoir and son Elmer visit Cedar Rapids on Friday
11/20/1919	46	Son, Elmer Yenney hits and gashes his chin and tongue at basketball practice; called a 'severe and painful' wound.
12/4/1919	46	Son, Elmer plays 'Peter Hartleigh' in the school play, "All on Account of Polly". *I'm assuming mom/dad went to see it :-)
12/18/1919	46	Son, Elmer is listed as having top grades at his high school with a 93.9% average overall.
1/29/1920	47	Children, Elmer and Margaret take part in a Declamatory Contest or oratorical and dramatic readings and plays
2/20/1920	47	Melchoir goes to Huron, SD to visit Melchoir Jr, who had taken a job there in 1916 and since moved his family.

7/15/1920	47	Melchoir and his section crew of 8 men escape death/serious injury (it is reported). As the men were standing in their motorcar and rounding a sharp bend, a fully-laden freight car stood in their path. Yenney set the brakes and yelled 'jump'. Everyone did. After the engine and motor car disputed the right of way, an invoice was taken. It was found that no one was badly injured, but the motor car was wrecked with its pilot knocked off the engine. It was judged to be an 'unfortunate accident'.

2/24/1938	62	Mrs. Melchoir Yenney (Barbara) arrives home after spending a week with Chas Knight and Elmer Yenney families in Janesville
12/28/1939	63	Melchoir/Barbara hold Christmas day. Melchoir Jr/family, Elmer/family, Chas/Margaret Knight, & Freida/RA Crider were all there. (*RA is a veterinarian and does by 'Dr.')
7/24/1941	65	Melchoir/Barbara Yenney return home Saturday night after 10 days in Janesville at the Elmer Yenney/Chas Knight homes. Chas/Margaret brought the elder Yenney's home and then returned to Janesville.
9/7/1941	65	Chas/Margaret & Elmer/Ruth arrive in Elgin, called by the serious illness to Melchoir Yenney . Margaret remained as all went home after 3 days. By the time they had returned to Janesville, word had come of Melchoir's death, compelling them to turn around at Janesville and return to Elgin, Iowa. Melchoir Junior (Huron) and John (Waukegan) also came to Elgin.
9/8/1941	65	Melchoir Yenney (Senior) dies after long illness

9/9/1941	-	Melchoir's son, John, and family return to their home in Waukegan, IL after father's funeral

12/17/1942	-	Barbara Babler Yenney leaves Elgin to visit the Chas. Knight and Elmer Yenney homes in Janesville, WI
1/20/1944	-	Barbara Babler Yenney leaves Elgin to visit the Chas. Knight and Elmer Yenney homes in Janesville, WI
10/25/1945	-	Elmer/Ruth Yenney visit the R. A. Crider (sister Freida) family and Barbara Babler Yenney in Elgin. (*Note: Freida had two daughters named Margaret and Barbara (just to confuse things :-)

8/7/1947	-	Barbara Babler Yenney is brought home from St. Mary's hospital in Rochester, MN by Freida (Crider) and Margaret (Knight). The daughter's returned home but Ruth Wade Yenney came to look after Barbara. Mrs. Yenney's condition "remains about the same, but she is happy to be able to be in her own home again".
8/14/1947	-	Margaret Knight & Elmer Yenney come from Janesville to visit their mother Barbara Yenney, who is ill. Margaret remained with mother; Elmer returned to Janesville
8/14/1947	-	Margaret (Mrs. Chas Knight) and Elmer Yenney come visit their mother Barbara Babler Yenney in Elgin, who is now very ill. Margaret remains; Elmer returns to Janesville.
7/1/1949	-	Barbara (Bostrva) Babler Yenney (Melchoir's wife; Elmer's mother) dies at Mercy Hospital in Janesville, WI at 75 years old.
